Find Naloxone Now is a website that connects Kentuckians to naloxone, the drug used to reverse opioid overdose.

How does Find Naloxone Now KY work?

People that may witness an overdose can use the website to find no-cost naloxone at over 450 locations or to order by mail. Detailed training materials help Kentuckians learn how to respond to an overdose effectively and with compassion. Focused and tailored prevention information addresses rapidly changing risk across diverse populations.

- The landing page maps locations where naloxone can be obtained at no cost, by purchase, by using Medicaid, or by using **the insurance copay program**.
 - The **You Can Reverse Overdose** button on this, and every other tab displays a short, animated naloxone and rescue breathing training video in **English** and **Spanish**.
 - People who are unable to visit any of the locations on the map can use **The Ordering by Mail?** button to order no-cost naloxone delivered by mail to any address in Kentucky.
 - The **Ordering for an Agency?** button in the upper right directs first responders, healthcare providers, and community-based organizations to the most appropriate available grant-funded sources of naloxone for community distribution.
 - A **.zip folder** containing printable materials from the site in English and Spanish can be downloaded at the bottom of the page.
- The **What are Opioids?** and **What is Naloxone?** tabs provide very simple introductory information.
- The **How Do I Use Naloxone?** tabs offer more extensive training for responding to an overdose and providing aftercare including:
 - The **You Can Reverse Overdose** animated training video in **English** and **Spanish**.
 - Quick and simple naloxone and rescue breathing instructions on a **4 x 6-inch postcard** and a **2 x 3.5-inch business card**.
 - Trifold brochures with more extensive information about using naloxone nasal spray and injectable naloxone.
- The **Overdose Prevention** tab offers risk reduction strategies tailored to diverse populations in rapidly changing risk environments.
- **FAQs** are simple and mostly about using the website.

- The **Resources** tab links to our community partners.
- A folder of printable materials that closely reflect the website content is available from the Kentucky Department for Public Health Harm Reduction Program.
