Naloxone Kiosks

Naloxone kiosks are publicly accessible outdoor boxes that are designed to distribute naloxone anonymously around-the-clock.

Naloxone Kiosks can be placed anywhere in your community where there is increased risk for overdose.

Unlike vending machines, these boxes are inexpensive, portable and can be placed outside.

Where do we get the kiosks?

What goes in the kiosks?

Naloxone, overdose prevention and response information, harm reduction supplies, Syringe Service Program locations, links to Never Use Alone - anything you think may help people at risk for overdose.

Some organizations bundle or bag the items like you see here.



Where do we get naloxone for the kiosks?

Visit FindNaloxoneNowKY.org and click the "Ordering for an Agency?" button in the upper right corner. You'll be directed to answer a series of questions that will direct you to request naloxone from a grant funded source appropriate to your agency.

Where do we put the kiosks?

Naloxone Kiosks can be placed anywhere in your community where there is risk for overdose. Portable boxes can be easily moved to areas of increasing risk. The best locations are places that are easily accessible 24/7 by people who use drugs, their friends and family members. Libraries, motels, gas stations and emergency housing shelters are all good locations. Kiosks can be placed outdoors. Direct sunlight can harm naloxone, so a shady spot is ideal. If a kiosk has a clear front, make sure it doesn't face the sun.

Many kiosks have been placed in Kentucky communities through simple verbal agreement with business and property owners. Board approvals may be necessary when working with governmental agencies. Contact HarmReduction@ky.gov for sample written agreements.

How often should we stock the kiosks?

Most agencies that maintain Naloxone Kiosks stock anywhere from 8-12 kits once a week at each location. Bigger cities may require more frequent stocking of larger amounts.
